

OAKLAND UNIVERSITY. Applicants must demonstrate or have the potential to produce scholarly research and effective teaching. A Ph.D. in criminology/criminal justice or a related field is required at the time of appointment, August 15, 2018. Teaching load, salary and benefits are competitive. Oakland University is an Affirmative Action/Equal Opportunity Employer and encourages applications from women and/or minorities.

We seek candidates who can contribute to our program needs in corrections, homeland security, terrorism, and/or foreign or domestic radicalization processes. In addition, preference may be given to candidates who could teach courses in additional core program areas. Candidates should have an appreciation of and commitment to the value of diversity and developing a diverse faculty and student body.

Located near many cultural and recreational resources in suburban Detroit, Oakland University (<http://www.oakland.edu>) is a state university enrolling approximately 20,000 students. Given metro Detroit's myriad transportation avenues (including highways, railways, and waterways) and its proximity to national and international borders, and the presence of many federal agency field offices in Detroit, Oakland University is an ideal location for addressing issues of corrections, homeland security, and terrorism.

Specifically, candidates should describe their efforts to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion in their previous positions and how they plan to continue in this role at Oakland.
