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Florida Atlantic University (FAU) **School of Criminology and Criminal Justice (SCCJ)** invites applications for a Visiting Assistant Professor for the 2018-2019 academic year on the Boca Raton campus. The SCCJ is FAU's second largest academic program, with just over 2,000 undergraduate and 100 graduate students. Applicant research/teaching specialization is open, but the Visiting Assistant Professor should expect to teach classes in our undergraduate core (methods of research, criminology, and/or ethics) and within her/his area of specialization. The teaching load for the position is three undergraduate courses per semester (Fall and Spring), plus nominal service-related activities that seek to advance the standing of the SCCJ.

About the School

FAU is a Carnegie doctorate-granting university (RU/high research activity) with over 30,000 students and is a designated Hispanic Serving Institution. FAU's strategic plan focuses on healthy aging, neuroscience, environmental science, and sensing and smart systems, supported by scholarly activities that address diversity, leadership, big data analytics, global perspectives and participation, community engagement, undergraduate research, healthy and sustainable campus environments, and peace, justice, and human rights. The SCCJ is the second largest undergraduate degree program by enrollment at FAU and offers the Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice and a Master of Science in Criminology and Criminal Justice. School initiatives include community engagement, study abroad, high school summer camps, a fully online undergraduate degree program, research colloquia, and research partnerships with the public, private, and not-for-profit sectors. Our School values racial and cultural diversity and inclusion.

Qualifications

Competitive candidates will demonstrate A) an interest in undergraduate teaching and research, B) a commitment to engaging criminal justice agencies that benefits students and faculty and that is consistent with FAU's move toward Carnegie research and community engagement classifications, and C) the ability to complement classroom learning with student involvement in public service. To identify viable candidates, the selection committee will be looking for excellence in teaching, attention to detail, intrinsic motivation, and a willingness to be a team player. A Ph.D. in criminology, criminal justice, or a related field from an accredited institution is required at the time of the appointment (ABD candidates may apply with the expectation that they will have their degree in hand by the fall of 2018); a J.D. alone will not substitute for a Ph.D.
