



\$25,000+ Graduate Research Assistantships Available

- The [Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice](#) at [FIU](#) is seeking to fill up to two graduate research assistantships to start Fall 2022 (August). The minimum annual stipend amount is \$25,000 along with tuitions waivers.
- Eligibility is limited to those who have completed a master's degree in criminology, criminal justice, or an allied discipline by Summer 2022.
- Applicants should have a clear and direct interest in studying racial and ethnic disparities, prosecutorial decision making, courts and sentencing, community engagement, and performance measurement and evaluation. Familiarity with both quantitative and qualitative methods is preferred.
- Selected applicants will be admitted into the [Ph.D. program in International Crime and Justice](#) and will work as a member of the [Prosecutorial Performance Indicators](#) research team. This will include the opportunity to directly work with prosecutors, analyze large administrative data sets, collect quantitative survey data, and conduct qualitative interviews.
- In addition to a series of [technical reports](#), publications based on PPIs data appear or are forthcoming in *Criminology*, *Journal of Research in Crime and Delinquency*, *Crime & Delinquency*, and *Criminal Justice and Behavior*.
