



The Department of Criminal Justice at Temple University seeks applicants for a tenure-track faculty appointment at the Associate or Assistant Professor level to begin Fall 2022. Applicants holding doctorates in Criminal Justice, Criminology, or a related social science discipline are strongly preferred. Related social science disciplines include, but are not limited to, African American Studies, Critical Studies, Geography, Latino Studies, Law and Society, Political Science, Public Health, Psychology, Social Work, Sociology, and Urban Studies. Highly qualified ABDs may be considered if evidence can be shown that completion of the Ph.D. will occur prior to Fall 2022. Consideration will not be given to those holding only a J.D. degree.

The department has a strong commitment to high-quality, collaborative, policy-oriented, interdisciplinary research. Faculty members have a very strong track record of success securing external grants from government and public funders at the federal, state, and local levels. Applicants must possess a demonstrated record of high-quality scholarship and research productivity, significant potential for extramural grants, and a strong commitment to teaching excellence. Please include with your application materials (1) a cover letter, including a statement of your research experience and scholarly goals, (2) a teaching portfolio (including experience, teaching philosophy, student evaluations, peer reviews, etc.), (3) a brief statement of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, (4) curriculum vitae, (5) selected publications/writing samples, and (6) at least three reference letters.
