Instructor Position

The University of South Carolina invites applications for one full-time, non-tenure track instructor position in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice to begin January 2022. Responsibilities include teaching undergraduate courses, advising undergraduate students, directing undergraduate student research as needed, providing service to the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at USC-Columbia, and keeping up with new and developing knowledge and issues in the field. The position is a non-tenure track, 9-month appointment with a teaching load of 8 courses for the academic year. While some instructional assignments may include distance delivery, instructors must be available for on-campus courses in Columbia. Applicants must hold a master's or Ph.D. degree in criminology, criminal justice, or a closely related field or a J.D. at the time of appointment. Applicants must be capable of teaching introductory and upper-division courses, and preference will be given to expertise in at least one area that will complement the existing strengths of the Department. Commitment to excellence in teaching and fostering student learning is expected, and experience as a professional in the field is a plus. This is an annual appointment that may be renewed, contingent upon satisfactory performance, departmental needs, and the availability of funding.
