The School of Criminology is inviting applications for **one** tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level, starting September 1, 2017 or January 1, 2018.

Assistant Professor, Tenure Track.

DUTIES: To undertake research, and to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels in the School of Criminology. The area of specialization is open.

QUALIFICATIONS: A Ph.D. in Criminology or related field, or a J.D./LL.B., in addition to a LLM or doctorate in law, completed by the employment start date, is expected. The area of specialization is open. All applicants must have a strong publication record, and demonstrated potential to develop a strong research program within their area of specialization.

The School has a well-established undergraduate program with over 900 majors and minors. It also offers graduate programs leading to the degrees of M.A. and Ph.D. There are exceptional research opportunities which include access to key research centres and institutes including the Criminology Research Centre, the Institute for Studies in Criminal Justice Policy, the International Cyber-Crime Research Centre, the Institute for Canadian Urban Research Studies, the Mental Health, Law and Policy Institute, the Centre for Forensic Research and the Centre for Restorative Justice. The teaching faculty is multi-disciplinary and, at present, consists of 28 members.
