

The Department of Sociology and Criminology & Law at University of Florida is inviting applications for a Lecturer in Criminology & Law to begin August 2017. This is a nine-month, time-limited, full-time, non-tenure accruing position, with the possibility of annual renewal. The Lecturer will teach required or high-demand courses for the UF Online in Criminology & Law program, as well as contribute to the instructional needs of the on-campus residential Criminology & Law program. The teaching assignment will be three (3) courses per semester, including Research Methods and one or more of the following: Criminal Procedure, Law Enforcement or Media and Crime. The successful candidate must be ABD or have a Ph.D. upon appointment from a discipline related to the study of crime, justice and law and show a specialization in Criminology, and Criminal Justice, or other social science approaches to the study of crime and justice.

Applications must be submitted on-line at <http://explore.jobs.ufl.edu/cw/en-us/listing/> and must include a letter of application, CV, a writing sample, evidence of teaching excellence and accomplishments, samples of peer or student teaching evaluations (as available), and teaching philosophy. In addition, three letters of recommendation should be submitted via email to soccrimsearch@clas.ufl.edu. For full consideration, application materials should be received by March 1, 2017 when the committee will begin reviewing applications. Applications received after this date may be considered at the discretion of the Committee and/or hiring authority.

All candidates for employment are subject to a pre-employment screening which includes a review of criminal records, reference checks, and verification of education.

The final candidate will be required to provide an official transcript to the hiring department upon hire. A transcript will not be considered "official" if a designation of "Issued to Student" is visible. Degrees earned from an education institution outside of the United States are required to be evaluated by a professional credentialing service provider approved by National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES), which can be found at <http://www.naces.org/>.
