

The **University of Nebraska at Omaha School of Criminology and Criminal Justice (SCCJ)** invites applications for a tenure-track assistant or advanced assistant professor position to begin August 13, 2018. Candidates must hold a Ph.D. in Criminology, Criminal Justice, or a related field. Candidates should demonstrate their potential for, or achievement in, developing a nationally recognized research agenda (e.g., publications in high impact criminology and criminal justice journals, securing external funding); demonstrate an interest in applied criminal justice (i.e., engaging in funded research with criminal justice agencies and organizations); and, demonstrate an ability or interest in teaching and mentoring students. Preference will be given to candidates who hold expertise in **juvenile justice** or **victimology**, but other specializations will be considered.

UNO is a premier metropolitan university and has been designated a Doctoral Granting Research University by the Carnegie Foundation. Located in the heart of Omaha adjacent to city parks and thriving neighborhoods, the UNO campus has a growing student population with more than 15,000 students. New student housing, ongoing expansion and renovation of buildings, and strong NCAA Division I sports add to a rich campus life firmly rooted in strong university-community partnerships.

The SCCJ is a Ph.D. granting program with courses offered on the Omaha and Lincoln campuses in the University of Nebraska system. This assistant professor position is assigned to the Omaha campus. We offer degrees at the undergraduate, masters, and doctoral level. The SCCJ has approximately 900 majors and 100 graduate students at the Masters and Doctoral level. The SCCJ has excellent resources to support faculty research, strong ties to local and state criminal justice agencies, and houses the legislatively funded Nebraska Center for Justice Research, and the Juvenile Justice Institute.
