Instructor Position

The University of South Carolina invites applications for one full-time instructor position in the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice to begin August 2017. Responsibilities include teaching undergraduate courses, advising undergraduate students, directing undergraduate student research as needed, providing service to the Department of Criminology and Criminal Justice at USC-Columbia, and keeping up with new and developing knowledge and issues in the field. The position is a non-tenure track, 9-month appointment with a teaching load of 7 courses for the academic year and advising duties. Applicants must hold a master's or Ph.D. degree in criminology, criminal justice, or a closely related field or a J.D. at the time of appointment. Applicants must be capable of teaching introductory and upper-division courses. Preference will be given to applicants with demonstrated successful college-level teaching and to those who are able to cover multiple portions of the undergraduate curriculum. Commitment to excellence in teaching and fostering student learning is expected.

The University of South Carolina's main campus is located in the state capital, close to the mountains and the coast. A complete application will include a curriculum vita, three letters of recommendation, and a letter that describes teaching interests, experiences, and abilities.

For full consideration, complete applications must be received no later than April 10, 2017
