## MINUTES

1. Call to Order
2. Award Recipient Report

The two student recipients (Philip Mulvey, Arizona State University; Favian Martin, Old Dominion University) provided brief overviews of how they used the award monies to aid their research.

3. Roundtable Report

Dr. Vince Webb provided an overview of an ASC roundtable entitled “Preparing a new generation of translational criminologists: Is it time to reform doctoral education in criminology and criminal justice”. The purpose of the roundtable was to discuss making stronger connections between research and policy in criminology and criminal justice. Webb reported that while the roundtable facilitated a hearty discussion, the format (1 hour and 20 minutes) was too short for such an important discussion.
