

ADPCCJ Annual Meeting at ASC 2018

- U.S. News and World Report Rankings – Fall 2020 will transition to ADPCCJ, so the ranking for 2021 will be in conjunction with ADPCCJ
 - Suggested creating a fact sheet for each program
- 5 award recipients were selected from 18 applications
 - Caitlyn Brady – University of Central Florida
 - Sara Bryson – University of Central Florida
 - Kayla Allison-Gruenewald – Indiana University
 - Abbie Henson – Temple University
 - Shannon Magnuson – George Mason University
- Spring 2019 ADPCCJ Doctoral Awards are due March 15, 2019 and will be divided into two pools
 - Professional Development
 - Data Collection
 - Minimum of \$1,000 with at least 1 award in each category
 - No team awards
 - Ratings are determined based on the strength of the design, the importance of the research question, the perceived impact of the study, how feasible it is to finish the project, the quality, and articulation of how the support of ADPCCJ funds will help with completion
 - Standardizing due dates to October 15th and March 15th
- Topic proposals solicited for ACJS roundtable discussion, send to Jodi Lane – planning to discuss the summit
- Two universities were removed from the member list due to a failure to pay dues and submit a survey for two consecutive years: University of Maribor and University of Southern Mississippi
- Committee formed to update bylaws, will be voted on next year
- Next summit planning for Summer 2020 – Pauline from the University of Massachusetts tentatively volunteered
 - Participants cover transportation costs
 - ADPCCJ funds 50% of the cost and the hosting institution funds the other 50%, which includes rooms, food, and other expenses for about 40 people
 - Estimates to cost about \$17,000 total
